We invite you to Kaphulika, a refuge awaits. May you enjoy every moment.



# LOCATION

Africa, Malawi – Central region - The Thuma Forest reserve is one of Malawi's less known treasures, an untamed wilderness, of beautiful mountainous landscape protected and managed by Wildlife Action Group with an area of 197km2. It is situated between Lilongwe and Lake Malawi on the escarpment of the Great Rift Valley.

We are 93km from the Capital city Lilongwe, and KIA International Airport, Thuma is one of the few forest reserves in Malawi which is still home to a small but important population of elephants, along with over 36 mammals.

It has over 168 trees species, and to date recorded over 210 bird species and 60+ orchids.

# **ACCOMODATION**

Kaphulika house is a unique eco-built, exclusive rental property in the heart of the forest that has so much character in every corner.

This green build has been constructed using fallen trees and locally available materials and the house is run using solar energy.









# FACT FILE

This African oasis is an ideal retreat with opportunities for the more physically fit to partake in guided hikes tailored to fit your needs. It is the ideal getaway for 2 or 4 adults, 2 families, or a group of close friends who will experience the peace and tranquility, surrounded by the sounds of an African forest.

The house has 2 large en-suite bedrooms, each with its own private khonde and a comfortable double bed made with crisp, linen sheets. The rooms can also be fitted with extra beds for children. The large en-suite bathrooms are open to the African sky and the huge baobab trees, with solar powered hot water showers.

The very large and beautiful thatched roof of the house, keeps you cool in the hotter months. There is a large sitting / dining area with shared khonde, bbq, swimming pool and small sun house with hammock to soak in the amazing views.

Our local staff live on site; Phillip our fantastic cook, along with Kennedy and Godfrey cook, clean and cater to your every need.

We also provide Free WIFI, enabling you to still stay in contact with loved ones (or your office).











#### DESCRIPTION

Kaphulika is the ultimate eco-lodge. A hidden gem. A family/friends getaway from the city. A place to recuperate from travel fatigue or a romantic weekend. This is a retreat where one will feel relaxed, comfortable and energized.

By day, one can swim, bird watch, read, watch the warthogs come feed on the beautiful lawn and, as night falls, one can star gaze sitting around the firepit, sipping wine or gin and tonics, listening to the hyena calling and if lucky hear the elephants eating close by. Your stay here will ensure that you give something back to this beautiful place.

# NEED TO KNOW


### **GETTING THERE**

Use the A5 road From Lilongwe approx. 90k, take the first dirt road of the right after passing the new solar plant (escom on the left, theres a sign saying social Islamic development). From the tar mac it is another 9km to the gate and then a further 4kms inside the forest. Check out google Maps.

- No day visits allowed
- Must have a reservation in advance.

# WHAT TO BRING

- Lightweight clothes, a hat, binoculars, sunglasses and mosquito repellent
- Loose trousers, long sleeves for the evenings, shorts, t-shirts, swimwear, shawl or fleece
- If hiking bring natural/green or khaki coloured clothing
- Sunscreen, medical kit and good head torch
- Comfortable walking shoes for the bush, flip flops/sandals for lazying around the house
- Camera and any books to help you identify the birds and fauna around the park.
- Universal plug adapters / converters.



# DAILY MANAGEMENT AND STAFF

There are staff on site to cook and cater to your every need and to ensure your stay is enjoyable.

#### **CLIMATE**

- Weather: The days are generally hot and dry and nights cooler, depending on the season
- Rainfall: Rainy season in normally November/December to March/ April
- Sunrise, sunsets, full moons or the milky are always magnificent
- Altitude: 700 to 1560 mtrs above sea level.

- Chichewa is spoken amongst local staff.

# MEALS AND FOOD

- The house is self-catering, bring your own food and drink and we will be delighted to cook and prepare everything for you
- Cooking oil, bread, butter etc.
- International visitors we can arrange food for you.

### WATER

- Clean, fresh safe bore hole water is available free of charge
- Ice is available
- Water is in all rooms over night
- Water is served with all meals.

### **COMMUNICATIONS**

- Mobile phone network is Airtel and TNM, however network is sporadic
- We do have free WIFI for your use if so needed, please do ask our staff.

### **CURRENCY**

 Bookings, activities, park entrance fees are quoted in USA however local currency Malawi kwacha is accepted using current day rate.

### **PAYMENTS**

 All payment for accommodation, activities, entrance etc. should be arranged in advance and at time of booking confirmation.

## **VEHICLES**

- High wheel drive vehicle is recommended
- There is vehicles and drivers available to drive guests for activities prearranged.

# **ELECTRICITY**

- There is solar power which supplies fridges, lights and any charging requirements
- You need to bring converters and universals plug adapters
- We kindly ask that you charge any electrical equipment during the hours of 10am to 4pm and turn off lights when you are not in the room
- Hot water is provided by solar geysers.

### **TIPPING**

 Tipping staff is a custom in Malawi and very much appreciated. A lot of people you may not see are working hard to make your stay as enjoyable as possible. We operate a communal tipping system which is distributed to all staff at the end of the month.

### HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS

- Full health and medical insurance
- Preventative malaria medication
- Yellow fever vaccination is required on entry to Malawi.
